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Mughal and modern times, and he lists work in the major European languages, including Russian, and in the major Indian languages, including Bengali as well as those more obviously relevant. One may regret that the basic principle of arrangement is alphabetical under authors' names, but it would be gratuitous to point to errors or omissions in a pioneering work.

SHAH ALAM II AND THE EAST INDIA COMPANY. By KALIKINKAR DATTA. pp. viii, 148. Calcutta, World Press, 1965.

This is a careful and not unsympathetic study of the unsuccessful career of Shah Alam II, Mughal emperor in a time of troubles between 1759 and 1806, with particular reference to his relations with the British East India Company.

KUKA MOVEMENT. By FAUJA SINGH BAJWA. pp. xvi, 236. Delhi, Motilal Banarsidass.

This is an interesting but hardly a dispassionate study of the Kukas, a sect of religious reformers who wanted to restore the primitive purity of Sikhism in its early days and who were involved in a clash with the British government in 1872.

THE MUTINY OUTBREAK AT MEERUT IN 1857. By J. A. B. PALMER. pp. xii, 176. Cambridge U.P., 1966.

Through a detailed examination of the events at Meerut on the evening of 10th May, 1857, Mr Palmer has approached some general questions concerning the origins of the Indian Mutiny—the existence of long-term plans, the extent of co-operation between the Meerut and other regiments, the degree of official awareness of the significance of greased cartridges. The book gains from the author's awareness of the work of Lefebvre and Rudé on the behaviour of crowds in the French Revolution.

## South-East Asia

A HISTORY OF BURMA. By MAUNG HTIN AUNG. pp. xii, 363. New York and London, Columbia U.P., 1967. £5 8s.

Dr. Htin Aung follows *The stricken peacock* with an interpretation of the whole course of Burmese history from Tapussa and Bhallika to General Ne Win. Disarmingly, he admits his partisanship. He believes that Harvey "had very strong prejudices against the Burmese", and that Hall "looks at Burmese history from the official British point of view" because he was a member of the I.E.S. Dr. Htin Aung's refutation of them is innocent of footnotes, but has ten pages of bibliographical notes at the end. These are not always reliable: he supposes *Razadiri ayedawbon* to be "not yet printed" (p. 347), but the Mon original was published in Pak Lat in 1910, the Burmese translation in Mandalay in 1922, and the Thai one in Bangkok in 1935.

KAMUS MANGGARAI I: MANGGARAI-INDONESIA. By JILIS A. J. VERHEIJEN. pp. xxviii, 772, map. 's-Gravenhage, Martinus Nijhoff, 1967. Fl. 115.

Manggarai is an Indonesian language of western Flores, assigned to the Bima-Sumba group, phonologically relatively complex but morphologically much reduced. A grammar by Father Burger was published in the *Bijdragen* in 1946. Father Verheijen has chosen Bahasa Indonesia as the target language for his dictionary, which will encourage Indonesian scholars to consult it and will minimally inconvenience likely Western users; the introduc-
